CLINICAL FELLOW IN INFLAMMATORY BOWEL DISEASE

We are looking to appoint a clinical fellow in Inflammatory Bowel Disease. This post is designed to enhance patient recruitment to commercial and investigator led clinical research into inflammatory bowel disease and also to support the management of patients in our adolescent and adult IBD clinics. It would suit an experienced trainee in gastroenterology who wants super-specialist training in IBD, a trainee in gastroenterology who wants to undertake a period of research and requires time to build some preliminary data, or an exceptional junior trainee who wishes to get experience in IBD before embarking on a gastroenterology training program.

Inflammatory Bowel Disease Barts and the London School of Medicine and Barts Health NHS Trust has an international reputation for translational research and clinical excellence. Barts Health NHS Trust has one of Europe's largest Inflammatory Bowel Disease services, with dedicated paediatric, adolescent and adult IBD clinics a full multidisciplinary team. Our large portfolio of clinical and investigator led IBD clinical research is supported by 2 CLRN funded research nurses, as well as access to a fully staffed clinical research centre. Many of the IBD clinicians have joint appointments in the Centre for Immunobiology at the Blizard Institute (Barts and the London school of Medicine, Queen Mary University of London).

The IBD Clinical Fellow will work in the Blizard Institute and Barts Health NHS Trust to recruit patients from all Barts Health sites. Working clinically with the full multidisciplinary team you will promote high standards of both patient care and research practice. You should have excellent communication skills, together with the ability to organize and motivate others. You should be able to demonstrate enthusiasm and innovation when faced with challenges and will utilise management skills in conducting the research and managing your caseload.

Previous experience in clinical research and IBD management is desired but not essential as a comprehensive training program will be available to the successful candidate. Likewise, previous experience in colonoscopy is desired but not essential. This post offers excellent opportunities in gaining experience in the management of complex IBD and undertaking clinical research while being supported by the clinical and research leads in IBD.

This post is full-time for 12 months. There may be an opportunity to extend your contract for longer period. Starting salary will be on the clinical lecturer scale depending on experience plus £1,470 London Allowance.

You will work under the direction of Dr James Lindsay and Dr Gareth Parkes

Candidates must be able to demonstrate their eligibility to work in the UK in accordance with the Immigration, Asylum and Nationality Act 2006. Where required this may include entry clearance or continued leave to remain under the Points Based Immigration Scheme.
